Course Description:

The AP French Language and Culture course is intended for students in their fifth year of study of French. It is designed to enable advanced learners of French to become competent in interpersonal, interpretive, and presentational communication within the meaningful study of six course themes: Global Challenges, Science and Technology, Contemporary Life, Personal and Public Identities, Families and Communities, and Beauty and Aesthetics. Students who enroll in this course should already have a good command of the grammar and considerable competence in listening, reading, speaking and writing. The course guides the students to explore culture and events in both the contemporary and historical settings and to examine products and practices of the target culture with regards to their perspectives. By integrating the basic four language learning components, the students will broaden and yet refine their writing skills, their listening comprehension, and their verbal communication throughout the various themes, using several primary textbooks and other authentic materials and resources. French is used exclusively in the classroom by both teacher and students.

Standards:

7.1 World Languages All students will be able to use a world language in addition to English to engage in meaningful conversation, to understand and interpret spoken and written language, and to present information, concepts, and ideas, while also gaining an understanding of the perspectives of other cultures. Through language study, they will make connections with other content areas, compare the language and culture studied with their own, and participate in home and global communities.
