Course Description:

This full year course gives students a deep comprehension of literary masterpieces (poetry, short stories, and novels) from Spain, as well as from Latin America, through an intensive study of vocabulary, grammar, themes, and analysis and critique of the work chosen. The advanced placement board mandates the select authors. The student ultimately prepares for the AP Spanish Literature Exam.
